Hazard Mitigation

Hazard mitigation is defined as long-term, independent solutions to reduce future risk to life and property from **natural hazard** events.

MITIGATE HAZARDS





















This is an on-going process that occurs before, during, and after disasters and serves to break the cycle of repeated damage and repair.



Hazard Mitigation Assistance

- Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP): Funding for California hazard mitigation actions. Available as result of major disaster declarations. Ongoing acceptance of proposals (Notice of Interest).
- Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC):
 Annual, nationally-competitive program funding mitigation actions. Process starts each year in August.
- Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA): Annual, nationallycompetitive program funding mitigation actions that protect properties insured by National Flood Insurance Program. Process starts each year in August.



Hazard Mitigation Assistance

BRIC/FMA - annual

 - NOI window in September/October
 - Competitive nationwide

Recent Funding Opportunity

BRIC and FMA 2023*

- NOFO release by FEMA expected August 2023*
 - Actual release date was 10/12/2023
- NOI (proposal) due to OES October 27, 2023*
- Subapplication due to OES December 13, 2023*
- Application from OES to FEMA February 2023*
- Notification of selection by FEMA Summer 2024*

Eligibility Requirements

- Be an eligible subapplicant:
 - City, County, Special District
 - Federally Recognized Tribes
 - Eligible to apply to FEMA as an Applicant
 - Eligible to apply to Cal OES as a Subapplicant
 - Private Nonprofit Organizations (PNPs) (not eligible for BRIC/FMA)
- Must have a FEMA-approved and locally adopted Local Hazard Mitigation Plan
- PNPs in HMGP are exempt from this requirement



Eligibility Requirements

- Have an eligible activity:
 - Addresses a problem caused by a natural hazard
 - Solution provides long term protection to people, structures, and/or infrastructure
 - Is not dependent upon on other actions to be successful
- Be able to answer the following:
 - What is the natural hazard?
 - What is the problem caused by the natural hazard?
 - What will happen if the project is not completed?



Subapplication Types

Planning:

Develop or Update a Local Hazard Mitigation Plan

Advance Assistance

- Prioritizes socially vulnerable communities
- Funds development of a shovel ready project
 - Studies or investigation to determine best solution for the problem
 - Development of Benefit Cost Analysis (BCA)
 - Development of complete subapplication



Subapplication Types

- Regular Project:
 - Non-Phased (Shovel-Ready)
 - Solution is known
 - All locations are known
 - Design is 60% or greater
 - Phased Project (Phase 1 Design, Phase 2 Construction)
 - Solution is known, but
 - All locations or all participants are not known, or
 - Design level is less than 60%
- Other: (5 percent initiative and Planning Related)
