# AHSC is part of the California Climate Investments (CCI), a statewide initiative that puts billions of Cap-and-Trade dollars to work.

#### **Projects Combine:**

- Green Affordable Housing (50% of application)
- Near Public Transit
- Zero–Emission Vehicles & Transit Amenities
- Active Transportation Infrastructure
- Urban Greening (Trees, gardens, water infiltration)





# AHSC Impacts: 185 Projects Across California

Over 17,000 affordable homes



Reduction of 5 million metric tons of CO2



Over 290 miles of new and improved bike ways





# What does AHSC fund?

- AHD: Affordable Housing Developments
  - O Rental Projects (loan)
  - Homeownership Projects (grant)
- HRI: Housing-Related Infrastructure
  - O Infrastructure improvements as required as Condition of Approval
  - O Factory built housing components
  - On-site energy storage (battery arrays)

- STI: Sustainable Transportation Infrastructure
  - Transit, Bikeways, Sidewalks, Crosswalks,
     Curb Ramps
- TRA: Transportation-Related Amenities
  - O Bike Parking, Bus Shelters, Urban Greening, Lighting
- PGM: Programs (3 years)
  - O Active Transportation Programs, Transit
    Ridership Programs, Air Pollution Reduction
    programs, Workforce Development Programs,
    Low-Income Car Share, Tenant Legal
    Counseling, AHD resident support



# **Set-Asides**



### Statutory:

- 50% of available funds for Affordable Housing\*
- 50% of available funds to Disadvantaged Communities\*
  - \*Not mutually exclusive

- Project Area Type funding goal
- Tribal entity funding goal
- Geographic funding targets

# **Technical Assistance**

- AHSC uses some funds to contract with Technical Assistance Providers for Capacity Building and Direct Application Support. TA team works in concert with program staff.
- Our Capacity Building aims to inform jurisdictions on the program and how they can bring their local communities together to engage and create a winning project.
- Our Technical Assistance helps recipients develop the local capacity to submit competitive applications and bring together the partnerships necessary to do so
- AHSC's TA & Capacity Building is designed to provide the support necessary for the state's diverse and under resourced communities to engage and be competitive in the program
  - Disadvantaged Communities and Low-Income Communities
  - Tribal Set-aside
  - Relatively Low-Capacity Jurisdictions
  - Regional and Rural representation

#### AHSC Round 8 Timeline:


- December 14, 2023 Guidelines published
- January 16, 2024 \$675 million NOFA released
- March 19, 2024 Applications due
- August, 2024 Awards voted on by Council

Minimum ask: \$10 million Maximum ask: \$50 million

It is our goal to keep AHSC on an annual schedule, for Round 9 will follow a similar timeline in 2025

# **Other SGC Programs**

- Transformative Climate Communities (TCC): Empowers the communities most impacted by pollution to choose their own goals, strategies, and projects to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and local air pollution. <a href="https://sgc.ca.gov/grant-programs/tcc/">https://sgc.ca.gov/grant-programs/tcc/</a>
- Community Resilience Centers (CRC): Funds new construction and upgrades of neighborhood-level resilience centers to provide shelter and resources during climate and other emergencies. - Tribal Capacity Building Pilot Program: The Tribal Capacity Building Pilot Program provides funding and technical assistance to California Native American tribes, enhancing their staff capacity to advance tribes' climate-related work.
